VAGRANCY (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 30, 1929.

George V. No. 30, 1929. An Act to amend the Vagrancy Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts. [Assented to, 19th November, 1929.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Vagrancy (Amendment) Act, 1929."

Amendment of Act No. 74, 1902. 2. The Vagrancy Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended—

Sec. 4 (1) (i).

(a) by omitting from paragraph (i) of subsection one of section four the words "common prostitute" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "known prostitute";

(b) by inserting in subsection one of section four next after paragraph (i) the following new paragraph:—

ef. N.Z. Act, No. 146, 1908, s. 49 (e). (j) habitually consorts with reputed criminals or known prostitutes or persons who have been convicted of having no visible lawful means of support;

Sec. 4 (2) (1) (m).

(c) by omitting from paragraphs (l) and (m) of subsection two of section four the words and figures "Liquor Act, 1898" wherever occurring and by inserting in lieu thereof the words and figures "Liquor Act, 1912";

Sec. 16.

(d) by omitting from section sixteen the words "Police Reward Fund" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "Police Superannuation and Reward Fund."
