An Act to continue the “Vine Diseases Act, 1886,” and the “Vine Diseases Act Amendment Act of 1888,” for a period of one year. [21st December, 1889.]

VINE DISEASES ACTS
CONTINUATION.

WHEREAS the “Vine Diseases Act, 1886,” as amended by the “Vine Diseases Act Amendment Act of 1888” will shortly expire; and it is expedient to extend the operation of the said Acts for a further period of one year: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Preamble.

1. The “Vine Diseases Act, 1886,” being the Act of the fiftieth Victoria numbered twenty-three, and the “Vine Diseases Act Amendment Act of 1888,” being the Act of the fifty-second Victoria numbered one, both which Acts would have expired on the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety, shall, and they are hereby declared to, remain and continue in force up to the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, but no longer.

No. 1 for one year.

2. This Act may be cited as the “Vine Diseases Acts Continuation Act of 1889.”
