Citation

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Justices (National Parks and Wildlife) (Repeal, Savings and Transitional) Regulation 1995.

Commencement

2. This Regulation commences on 1 September 1995.

Repeal

3. The National Parks and Wildlife (Short Description of Offences) Regulation 1989 is repealed.

Transitional

4. (1) This clause applies to any document (being an information, complaint, summons, warrant, notice, order or other document that relates to an offence alleged to have been committed before the repeal of the National Parks and Wildlife (Short Description of Offences) Regulation 1989), and so applies whether the document was issued, given or made before or after that repeal.

(2) The repeal of the National Parks and Wildlife (Short Description of Offences) Regulation 1989 does not affect the validity of any document to which this clause applies in which an expression that was prescribed by that Regulation, as in force immediately before its repeal, is used.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Regulation repeals the National Parks and Wildlife (Short Description of Offences) Regulation 1989 as a consequence of its having been superseded by regulations under the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974.

This Regulation is made under the Justices Act 1902, including section 154 (the general regulation making power) and section 145B.

This Regulation is made in connection with the staged repeal of subordinate legislation under the Subordinate Legislation Act 1989.
