## **COMPENSATION COURT ACT 1984—RULE**

## **NEW SOUTH WALES**

- 1. This Rule was made by the Rule Committee on 13th August 1992.
- 2. The Compensation Court Rules 1990 are amended by omitting Part 24 rule 6 (7) and inserting instead:
  - (7) Where the Court or the registrar orders under subrule (6) that parties may inspect documents and it is a term of that order that one party shall have first access to the documents, it shall, unless the Court or the registrar otherwise directs, be a further term (whether express or implied) of that order that:
    - (a) inspection on behalf of that party shall be carried out within:
      - (i) where the party is present when the order is made— 10 days after the making of the order; or
      - (ii) in any other case—10 days after that party is notified in writing of the order by another party;
    - (b) any claim for privilege in respect of any of the documents on behalf of that party shall be made at the conclusion of the inspection of the documents; and
    - (c) any other party may inspect the documents as soon as the time for compliance has elapsed without inspection being carried out or, if the documents have been inspected on

behalf of that party, at the conclusion of that inspection except for any of the documents in respect of which a claim for privilege is made on behalf of that party.
