JUSTICES ACT 1902—REGULATION

(Relating to short descriptions of offences under the Roads Act 1993)

Commencement

1. This Regulation commences on 1 February 1994.

Amendment

2. The Justices (Short Descriptions of Motor Traffic and Other Offences) Regulation 1986 is amended:

- (a) by inserting in Schedule 1, before the matter relating to the Roads (General) Transitional Regulation 1993, the following matter:

Section 108 (2)—drive along a public road a vehicle that contravenes the weight restrictions imposed by the regulations	drive vehicle in breach of general weight limits

Section 108 (2)—cause to be driven along a public road a vehicle that contravenes the weight restrictions imposed by the regulations	cause vehicle to be driven in breach of general weight limits

- Section 112 (3)—fail to comply with the terms of a notice indicating weight restrictions applicable to certain roads, bridges, causeways and road-ferries breach weight limits for bridges etc.
- Section 235 (2)—be the owner of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under section 108 (2) is committed be owner of vehicle that breaches general weight limits
- Section 235 (2)—be the person in charge of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under section 108 (2) is committed be person in charge of vehicle that breaches general weight limits
- Section 235 (2)—be the owner of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under section 112 (3) is committed be owner of vehicle that breaches weight limits for bridges etc.
- Section 235 (2)—be the person in charge of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under section 112 (3) is committed be person in charge of vehicle that breaches weight limits for bridges etc.
- Section 235 (2)—be the owner of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under clause 10 of the Roads (Weight of Loads on Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993 is committed be owner of vehicle that breaches special weight limits for main roads
- Section 235 (2)—be the person in charge of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under clause 10 of the Roads (Weight of Loads on Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993 is committed be person in charge of vehicle that breaches special weight limits for main roads
- Section 235 (2)—be the owner of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under clause 10A of the Roads (Weight of Loads on Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993 is committed be owner of vehicle that breaches excess weight permit limits for main roads
- Section 235 (2)—be the person in charge of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under clause 10A of the Roads (Weight of Loads on Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993 is committed be person in charge of vehicle that breaches excess weight permit limits for main roads

Section 235 (2)—be the owner of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under clause 10 of the Roads (Weight of Loads on Roads other than Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993 is committed

be owner of vehicle that breaches excess weight permit limits for minor roads

Section 235 (2)—be the person in charge of a vehicle in respect of which an offence under clause 10A of the Roads (Weight of Loads on Roads other than Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993 is committed

be person in charge of vehicle that breaches excess weight permit limits for minor roads

- (b) by inserting in Schedule 1, after the matter relating to the Roads (General) Transitional Regulation 1993, the following matter:

Roads (Weight of Loads on Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993

Clauses 10, 15—drive along a main road a vehicle that contravenes the weight restrictions imposed under clause 10

drive vehicle on main road in breach of special weight limits

Clauses 10, 15—cause to be driven along a main road a vehicle that contravenes the weight restrictions imposed under clause 10

cause vehicle to be driven on main road in breach of special weight limits

Clauses 10A, 15—drive along a main road a vehicle that exceeds the maximum weight allowed by an excess weight permit

drive vehicle on main road in breach of excess weight permit limits

Clauses 10A, 15—cause to be driven along a main road a vehicle that exceeds the maximum weight allowed by an excess weight permit cause vehicle to be driven on main road in breach of excess weight permit limits

- (c) by inserting in Schedule 1, in appropriate order under the heading “Roads (Weight of Loads on Roads other than Main Roads) Transitional Regulation 1993” the following matter:

Clauses 10, 16—drive along a public road (not being a main road) a vehicle that contravenes the weight restrictions imposed under clause 10 drive vehicle on minor road in breach of special weight limits

Clauses 10, 16—cause to be driven along a public road (not being a main road) a vehicle that contravenes the weight restrictions imposed under clause 10 cause vehicle to be driven on minor road in breach of special weight limits

Clauses 10A, 16—drive along a public road (not being a main road) a vehicle that exceeds the maximum weight allowed by an excess weight permit drive vehicle on minor road in breach of excess weight permit limits

Clauses 10A, 16—cause to be driven along a public road (not being a main road) a vehicle that exceeds the maximum weight allowed by an excess weight permit cause vehicle to be driven on minor road in breach of excess weight permit limits

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe short descriptions for certain offences under the Roads Act 1993 with respect to the overloading of vehicles. The short descriptions facilitate the enforcement of penalty notices for these offences.

This Regulation is made under the Justices Act 1902, including section 154 (the general regulation making power) and section 145B.
