Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to provide for demerit points to be incurred for offences relating to discarding a lighted tobacco product or match or any incandescent material on a road or road related area.

This Regulation is made under the *Road Transport Act 2013*, including sections 23 (the general statutory rule-making power) and 32.
