

ENDEMIC DISEASES ORDINANCE 1964.

No. 14 of 1964.

An Ordinance to amend the *Endemic Diseases Ordinance 1928-1957*.

[Assented to 9th April, 1964.]

BE it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Northern Territory of Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910-1962*, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Endemic Diseases Ordinance 1964*.

(2.) The *Endemic Diseases Ordinance 1928-1957* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Endemic Diseases Ordinance 1928-1964*.

Definitions.

2. Section three of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from the definition of "Endemic disease" the words "and Relapsing Fever" and inserting in their stead the words ", Relapsing Fever or any other disease declared by the Administrator, in accordance with section three A of this Ordinance, to be an Endemic disease for the purposes of this Ordinance".

3. After section three of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

"3A. The Administrator may, on the advice of the Chief Health Officer, by notice in the *Gazette*, declare a disease to be an Endemic disease for the purposes of this Ordinance."

Disease may be declared to be endemic disease.

Expenses of removal, isolation and maintenance.

4. Section eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the words "the Government Resident" and inserting in their stead the words "the Director-General of Health".
