

EXPLOSIVES ORDINANCE 1968

No. 4 of 1968

An Ordinance to amend the *Explosives Ordinance*
1964

[Assented to 20 March, 1968]

BE it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Northern Territory of Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act* 1910-1967, as follows:—

Short title
and citation

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Explosives Ordinance* 1968.

(2.) The *Explosives Ordinance* 1964 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Explosives Ordinance* 1964-1968.

Commencement

2. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the day on which the *Explosives Ordinance* 1964 comes into operation.*

Heading

3. Before section 1 of the Principal Ordinance, the following heading is inserted:—

“PART I.—PRELIMINARY.”

Parts

4. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the words and figures “Part VIII.—General (Sections 35-47).” and inserting in their stead the words and figures “Part VIII.—General (Sections 35-46).”

Further powers of
the Administrator
and Chief
Inspector, &c.

5. Section 14 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from paragraph (a) of sub-section (5.) the words “section fifteen” and inserting in their stead the words “section sixteen”.

Fireworks

6. Section 32 of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

“32.—(1.) A person shall not sell or dispose of fireworks at a time not being a time approved by the Administrator in Council by notice in the *Gazette* as a time permitted for the sale of fireworks.

“(2.) A person shall not sell or dispose of fireworks to a child under the age of thirteen years.

* Sections 1-9 and Section 42 of the *Explosives Ordinance* 1964 came into operation on 18 December, 1964. The remaining provisions of that Ordinance had not been brought into operation at 1 January, 1969.

“(3.) A person shall not throw, let off or fire any fireworks at a time not being a time approved by the Administrator in Council by notice in the *Gazette* as a time permitted for the firing of fireworks.

“(4.) A person shall not, except with the permission in writing of the Chief Inspector or a person authorized in writing by him, throw, let off, or fire any fireworks in a street, road, thoroughfare, or public place within the boundaries of a town.”.
