MOTOR ACCIDENTS (COMPENSATION) RATES OF BENEFIT REGULATIONS

1. CITATION

These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Accidents (Compensation) Rates of Benefit Regulations.

2. COMMENCEMENT

These Regulations shall come into operation on the commencement of the Motor Accidents (Compensation) Amendment Act (No. 2) 1984.

3. LOSS OF LIMB, &c.

For the purposes of section 17 of the Act, the prescribed amount is \$50,000.

4. MEDICAL AND REHABILITATION EXPENSES

For the purposes of section 18(5) of the Act, the prescribed amount is \$50,000.

5. DEATH BENEFITS

For the purposes of section 22 of the Act, the prescribed maximum amount is \$45,000, the prescribed minimum amount is \$6,000 and the prescribed amount is \$15.

6. DEATH OF DEPENDENT SPOUSE

For the purposes of section 23 of the Act, the prescribed minimum amount is 6,000 and the prescribed maximum amount is 45,000.

7. DEPENDENT PARENTS BENEFIT

For the purposes of section 24 of the Act, the prescribed amount is \$25.

8. DEPENDENT CHILDREN'S BENEFIT

For the purposes of section 25 of the Act, the prescribed amount is \$25.

9. FUNERAL BENEFITS

For the purposes of section 26 of the Act, the prescribed amount is \$650.
