AMENDMENT OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES (THIRD PARTY INSURANCE) REGULATIONS[†]

Commencement

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six.

The First Schedule
