By-laws under the National Parks and Gardens Ordinance 1959-1968

NATIONAL PARKS AND GARDENS (SIMPSON'S GAP NATIONAL PARK) BY-LAWS

Citation

1. These By-laws may be cited as the National Parks and Gardens (Simpson's Gap National Park) By-laws.

Definitions

2. In these By-laws, "the Reserve" means the land that was committed to the care, control and management of the Board by notice in *Northern Territory Government Gazette* No. 3 of 1958 dated 15 January, 1958.

Admission times

3. The Reserve is open to the public only from eight o'clock in the morning until ten o'clock in the evening.

Admission fees

- 4.—(1.) A fee is not payable for admission to the Reserve of a person who is under the age of seventeen years.
- (2.) A fee of Ten cents is payable to the Board for admission to the Reserve of a person who is not under the age of seventeen years.

Camping

5. A person shall not camp on the Reserve.

Penalty: Forty dollars.

Fires

6. A person shall not light a wood fire on the Reserve except in a fireplace provided by the Board.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

Speed limit 7. A person shall not drive a vehicle on an unsealed road on the Reserve at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour.

Penalty: Fifty dollars.

8.—(1.) Subject to the next succeeding clause of this by-law, a person shall not drive a vehicle on the Reserve except on a road.

Driving off roads and parking

Penalty: Fifty dollars.

- (2.) A person may drive into an area that has been set aside by the Board as a parking area.
- 9.—(1.) A person shall not permit a horse or bovine animal belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain on the Reserve.

Dogs, horses and cows

- (2.) A person who permits a dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain on the Reserve shall—
 - (a) keep it under his control; and
 - (b) ensure that it does not enter the water.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.
