# REGULATIONS 1974. No. 24\*

## By-laws under the Ports Ordinance

The Northern Territory Port Authority, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the *Ports Ordinance*, at a meeting held on 18th September, 1974, made the following By-laws.

#### AMENDMENTS OF THE PORT BY-LAWS

- 1.(1) The amendments effected by these By-laws do not operate to Application require a fee that has been assessed before these By-laws come into operation to be re-assessed.
- (2) Where a fee payable under the Port By-laws has not been assessed before these By-laws come into operation, it shall be assessed under the Port By-laws as amended by these By-laws.
  - 2. By-law 3(1) of the Port By-laws is amended—

Interpretation

- (a) by inserting before the definition of "container" the following definition:
  - "'cargo', means goods, load or freight carried from one port to another, and includes baggage, other than the first cubic metre of accompanied baggage;";
- (b) by omitting the definition of "vehicle";
- (c) by inserting before the definition of "tonne by volume" the following definition:
  - "'tonne', in relation to cargo or goods, means tonne by weight or tonne by volume, whichever measurement yields the greater tonnage;";
- (d) by omitting "1.115 cubic metres" from the definition of "tonne by volume" and substituting "1 cubic metre"; and
- (e) by inserting after the definition of "tonne by weight" the following definition:
  - "'vehicle' means any mobile mechanical or non-mechanical contrivance supported on wheels or tracks

or designed as a form of transport for persons or goods, and includes earth moving and road building machinery whether drawn or propelled;".

Sorting and stacking of cargo 3. By-law 64(2) of the Port By-laws is amended by omitting "tons" and substituting "tonnes".

Third Schedule

4. The Third Schedule to the Port By-laws is repealed and the following Schedule substituted:

#### "THIRD SCHEDULE

### WHARFAGE FFES, WHETHER INWARD OR OUTWARD

1. Oil in bulk	\$1.00 per kilolitre or part thereof
2. Animals	\$1.00 per animal
3. Cement in bulk	\$1.10 per tonne weight or part thereof
4. L.P. Gas	\$1.10 per tonne weight or part thereof

- Empty returns: (including containers, sacks, bags, boxes, cases, cartons, crates, drums, hides, packages and all other things used to contain cargo)
- 6. Goods not enumerated above

- 20 cents per cubic metre or part thereof
- \$1.30 per tonne weight or part thereof or cubic metre or part thereof (whichever measurement yields the greater wharfage fee) and, in addition, for each heavy lift other than a life of a container or a unitised cargo, \$5.00 per tonne weight or part thereof in excess of 20 tonnes".
