

Regulations under the *Stock Diseases Ordinance*

AMENDMENTS OF THE STOCK DISEASES REGULATIONS

1. Regulation 13 of the Stock Diseases Regulations is repealed and the following regulation substituted:

"13. (1) Subject to sub-regulations (2) and (3), a person shall not feed to swine, or suffer swine under his control to eat, waste food or refuse containing, or which has been in contact with, substances of animal origin, including the meat, fat, bones, blood, eggs, hatchery waste and viscera of any livestock or poultry. Prohibited
food for swine

Penalty: 200 dollars.

"(2) A product that has been subjected to a process which produces, to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Stock, a dry rendered, sterile product may be fed to swine.

"(3) The Chief Inspector may, in writing, exempt a person who is in control of swine from the provisions of sub-regulation (1), if—

- (a) that person applies to the Chief Inspector to be exempted stating the kind of food proposed to be fed to the swine; and
- (b) the Chief Inspector is satisfied that the feeding to the swine of that kind of food—
 - (i) is not likely to cause an occurrence, out-break or a spreading of stock disease; or
 - (ii) render the meat from the swine unsuitable for human consumption."
