Regulations under the Social Welfare Ordinance 1964

I, OGER LEVINGE DEAN, the Administrator of the Northern Territory of Australia, having received the advice of the Administrator's Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Social Welfare Ordinance 1964 and the Administrator's Council Ordinance 1959-1963, hereby make the following Regulations.

SOCIAL WELFARE REGULATIONS

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Welfare Regulations. Citation

2. A person who is found drunk on a reserve, except in a dwelling Drunkenness on place in which he is lawfully present, commits an offence.

Penalty: For a first offence, One pound or imprisonment for three days; and for any subsequent offence, Five pounds or imprisonment for fourteen days.

3.-(1.) A person on a reserve shall not-

- (a) behave in a riotous, disorderly or offensive manner; or
- (b) use language, or perform any act, calculated to or likely to cause a breach of the peace or to provoke or encourage disorderly behaviour.

(2.) A person on a reserve shall not-

- (a) fight; or
- (b) use language, or perform any act, calculated to or likely to provoke or encourage a fight.

(3.) In a prosecution for behaviour in an offensive manner, the prosecutor must establish that the behaviour was offensive to a witness.

4.—(1.) A person on a reserve shall not—

(a) discharge a firearm; or

(b) throw or discharge a stone or other missile

so that the action endangers, or frightens, or is calculated to endanger or frighten, the person or property of another.

Firearms or other missiles on reserves

(2.) A person shall not be liable for a contravention of a provision of this regulation if he establishes—

- (a) that he had reasonable cause or excuse for performing the action; and
- (b) that he exercised due care in his performance of the action.

Offences

5. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with a provision of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Twenty pounds, or imprisonment for two months.
