# Regulations under the Territory Parks and Wildlife Conservation Ordinance

I, JOHN ARMSTRONG ENGLAND, the Administrator of the Northern Territory of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the Territory Parks and Wildlife Conservation Ordinance.

### **TERRITORY WILDLIFE REGULATIONS**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Territory Wildlife Regulations.

2.(1) Subject to sub-regulation (2), an animal of a kind listed in column 1 of Schedule Certain animals 1, not being an animal of a species listed in column 2 of that Schedule, is an unprotected animal -

- (a) for the period in each year specified in column 3 of Schedule 1 in relation to that kind of animal; and
- (b) for the purpose of killing for human consumption.

(2) An animal which, under sub-regulation (1), is an unprotected animal cease to be unprotected where that animal or any flesh, bone, skin or other part of that animal is bought, sold or offered for sale.

(3) In this regulation, "sell" includes to supply for or in expectation of any reward or benefit paid or provided, or to be paid or provided by the person supplied or another person, whether or not any person was or is under an obligation to pay or provide a reward or benefit.

3. An animal of a species listed in column 1 of Schedule 2 is an unprotected animal Certain animals while it is in the area described in column 2 of that Schedule in relation to that species. <sup>unprotected in</sup> specific areas

4. It is a defence to a charge for an offence against section 29(1) of the Ordinance of Snakes may having killed or injured a snake if ---

- (a) the snake was within 100 metres of an occupied building; or
- (b) the defendant proves that he honestly believed that it was necessary to kill or injure the snake to avoid an immediate danger of death or injury to a person or a domestic animal.

5. An animal of a species listed in Schedule 3 is a pest.

6. An animal of a species listed in Schedule 4 is a prohibited entrant.

7.(1) A person may have in his possession or under his control a live specimen of vertebrate wildlife if -

- (a) that animal was lawfully obtained by that person; and
- (b) the total number of live specimens of vertebrate wildlife in his possession and under his control is not more than 10.

(2) A person may buy or otherwise acquire an animal from a person who may lawfully sell or otherwise dispose of that animal to him.
