## LOTTERY AND GAMING ORDINANCE 1960.\*

### An Ordinance to amend the *Lottery and Gaming Ordinance* 1940-1959.†

Short title  
and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Lottery and Gaming Ordinance* 1960.\*

(2.) The *Lottery and Gaming Ordinance* 1940-1959† is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Lottery and Gaming Ordinance* 1940-1960.

Commence-  
ment.

2. This Ordinance shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Administrator by notice in the *Gazette*.‡

3. After Section 13 of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

“13A. Notwithstanding anything contained in sections nine, ten, eleven and twelve of this Ordinance, the members of a society, association, or institution may raise funds by selling or disposing of goods, wares or merchandise by means of raffles, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) the society, association or institution is formed and conducted solely for charitable, cultural, educational or physical sporting purposes, and is approved by the Administrator in Council as such;
- (b) the raffles are conducted for such purposes and not for private gain;
- (c) the raffles are not advertised in any manner;
- (d) the value of each raffle ticket does not exceed two shillings;
- (e) the total value of the tickets sold for a particular raffle does not exceed Fifty pounds;
- (f) each raffle ticket is numbered and indicates clearly on its face its price and the raffle in respect of which it is sold; and

- (g) the raffle tickets are not displayed or offered for sale in any street.”.

4. Section fourteen of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the words—

“or enter any place where raffle tickets are being sold or a raffle drawn, and may investigate the legality of the sale thereof and supervise the drawing of the raffle.”.

5. Section thirty-four of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

prohibited.

- (a) by omitting from sub-section (3.) the words “or licensed dog-racing ground.” and inserting in their stead the words “not being a licensed dog-racing ground.”.

- (b) by inserting after sub-section (3.) the following sub-section:—

“(3A.) A person shall not after sunset on any day bet or wager or attempt or offer to bet or wager on a licensed dog-racing ground or on a licensed race-course being a licensed dog-racing ground unless the bet or wager is in respect of a dog race that is part of a programme of dog races being held on that licensed dog-racing ground.”.

6. Section forty-nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (1.) the word “Superintendent” and inserting in its stead the words “Deputy Commissioner”.

7. Section seventy-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

Licensing of  
dog-racing  
meetings.

- (a) by inserting after the word “club”, first occurring, the word “company”;
- (b) by inserting after the word “trustees”, second occurring, the word “company”; and
- (c) by adding at the end of sub-section (1.) the words “and is within a radius of twenty miles of the Post Office at Darwin.”.

8. Section seventy-three of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:—

Issue of  
licences

“(5.) A licence may be granted under this Part in respect of premises notwithstanding that a licence has been issued under another Part of this Ordinance in respect of the same premises.”.

**Definitions.**

9 Section seventy-five of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the definition of "club" and inserting in its stead the following definition:—

" 'club' —

- (a) in relation to horse racing, trotting racing and pony racing, includes any association or other body of persons established for the purpose of promoting, conducting or controlling the sport of horse racing, trotting racing or pony racing; and
  - (b) in relation to dog-racing, includes any company, association or other body of persons established for the purpose of promoting, conducting or controlling the sport of dog-racing."
