

NOMENCLATURE (PUBLIC PLACES) ORDINANCE 1945.*

An Ordinance relating to the Nomenclature of Public Places.

Citation.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Nomenclature (Public Places) Ordinance 1945.**

Definitions.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Committee” means the Nomenclature Committee established under this Ordinance;

“public place” includes natural features of the Territory and any avenue, road, street or place which the public is entitled to use.

Establishment
of
Nomenclature
Committee.

3. There shall be a Nomenclature Committee for the Territory which shall consist of the Administrator, who shall be the Chairman of the Committee, the Government Secretary and the Surveyor-General.

Committee to
make reports on
nomenclature.

4.—(1.) The Committee shall, from time to time, on its own motion or by direction of the Minister, make reports to the Minister recommending the nomenclature to be adopted for public places.

(2.) The Committee shall forward with each report all communications and particulars of all representations received by it in relation to any public place which is the subject of a recommendation in the report.

Powers of
Minister.

5.—(1.) The Minister may—

(a) approve, either without alteration or subject to such alteration as he thinks fit, any recommendation contained in any report of the committee;

(b) reject any recommendation; or

(c) return the report to the Committee for further consideration and the submission of another report.

(2.) Any recommendation in a report which has been approved by the Minister (whether with or without alteration) shall be notified in the *Gazette* and the public place, the name of which is specified in the recommendation so approved, shall be known by that name as from the date upon which it is so notified.
