2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have taken effect on commencement. the first day of January, 1940.

Definitions.

- "regulations" means rules, regulations or by-laws made No. 25, 1952, under an Ordinance (other than rules which relate s. 2. only to dates of sittings of a Court);
- "regulation-making authority" includes every authority authorized to make any regulations.
- 4.—(1.) The Administrator shall, forthwith after any regu-Numbering of lations are made, number them consecutively as nearly as may regulations. be in the order in which they are made, beginning in each year with the number one.

- (2.) Any regulations may, without prejudice to any other mode of citation, be cited by the number so given and the calendar year.
- (3.) Where regulations are required by any Ordinance to be published or notified in the Gazette or in the Gazette of the Northern Territory, a notice in the Gazette of the Northern

Territory of the regulations having been made, and of the place where copies of them can be purchased, shall be sufficient compliance with that requirement.

(4.) Regulations under this Ordinance may prescribe the classes of cases in which the exercise of a statutory power by any regulation-making authority constitutes or does not constitute the making of a regulation within the meaning of this section.

Proof of regulations.

5. Any printed paper, purporting to be a copy of regulations made by a regulation-making authority, and to be printed by the Government Printer or by the authority of the Government of the Commonwealth, shall in all Courts be evidence that those regulations have been duly made by the regulation-making authority and are in force.

Regulations.

6. The Minister may make regulations, not inconsistent with this Ordinance, prescribing all matters which are required or permitted to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to this Ordinance.
