MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to your Majesty in the present Session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it

therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Appropriation.

1. In addition to the several sums specified in the Parts marked respectively A, B, C, and D of the Schedule to this Act, and which sums are payable under the authority of the several Acts in those Parts respectively mentioned, there shall and may be issued and applied, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, the sums following, inclusive of the three several sums of Eight hundred and thirty thousand pounds, One million two hundred and sixty thousand pounds, and Eight hundred and forty thousand pounds already authorised to be applied towards the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, by "*The Appropriation Act of 1912-1913, No. 1,*" "*The Appropriation Act of 1912-1913, No. 2,*" and "*The Appropriation Act of 1912-1913, No. 3,*"* that is to say,—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Four million two hundred and forty-eight thousand and seventy-one pounds;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of Eight hundred and twenty-eight thousand eight hundred and twenty pounds thirteen shillings and eight pence;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of Two million eight hundred and eighty-five thousand two hundred and fifty pounds.

2. The sums granted by the first section of this Act and by "*The Appropriation Act of 1912-1913, No. 1,*" "*The Appropriation Act of 1912-1913, No. 2,*" and "*The Appropriation Act of 1912-1913, No. 3,*"* and which are set forth in the Parts marked respectively F, G, and H of the Schedule to this Act, amounting, as appears by the said Parts, in all to the sum of Seven million nine hundred and sixty-two thousand one hundred and forty-one pounds thirteen shillings and eight pence, are appropriated, and

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shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, for the purposes and services expressed in the said Parts F, G, and H, respectively.

3. In addition to the several sums specified in the Part marked E of the Schedule to this Act, and which sums were lawfully paid for the service of the year ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, under the authority of the Acts in that Part mentioned, there shall and may also be issued and applied the further sums following, that is to say,—

Supplementary Appropriation, 1911-1912. [Schedule, Part E.]

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, a further sum of Three hundred and sixty thousand four hundred and ninety pounds eleven shillings and six pence;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of One hundred and fifty-two thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds one shilling and eleven pence;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account a further sum of One hundred and ninety-six thousand seven hundred and eighty-two pounds seven shillings and one penny;

to defray Supplementary Charges for the service of the said year ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, and such sums shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, for the purposes and services expressed in the Parts marked I, K, and L of the Schedule to this Act.

4. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several sums for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order under his hand and directed to the Treasurer, from time to time orders and directs, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland.

Treasurer to pay moneys as directed by warrant.

5. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrants or orders, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom

the moneys are paid shall be a valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for any sum therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity.

6. The issue or application of any part or parts of the said sums of Three hundred and sixty thousand four hundred and ninety pounds eleven shillings and six pence, One hundred and fifty-two thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds one shilling and eleven pence, and One hundred and ninety-six thousand seven hundred and eighty-two pounds seven shillings and one penny, which has been made before the passing of this Act for the purposes expressed in the Parts marked I, K, and L of the Schedule to this Act, is hereby authorised and sanctioned, and the Treasurer is hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of any such issue or application.
