From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of One hundred and fifty thousand pounds; and

- From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of Four hundred thousand pounds.
- 2. The Treasurer of the State shall issue and pay the Treasurer to said several sums for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, as directed to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions by warrant. as the Governor, by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.
- 3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to Treasurer to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid be allowed by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing sums paid in as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective pursuance of warrant. persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

4. This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act Short title. of 1913-1914, No. 2."

An Act to Authorise the Appropriation out of the 4 Geo. V. Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland of a further Sum towards the Service of the Year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1914.

APPROPRIA-

THEREAS we, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Preamble. subjects, the members of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, have in the present Session of Parliament cheerfully granted to your Majesty the sum hereinafter mentioned towards the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in addition to the sums already granted during the present Session of Parliament towards And whereas we desire to make good the same services: out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland the

sum granted to your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Appropriation.

1. In addition to the sums of One million four hundred thousand pounds already applied from the Consolidated Revenue Fund (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account), Two hundred thousand pounds already applied from the Trust and Special Funds, and Seven hundred thousand pounds already applied from the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account towards the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, by "The Appropriation Act of 1913-1914, No. 1,"\* and "The Appropriation Act of 1913-1914, No. 2," there shall and may be issued and applied towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, the further sum following, that is to sav:—

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of One hundred thousand pounds.

Treasurer to pay moneys as directed by warrant. 2. The Treasurer of the State shall issue and pay the said sum, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.

Treasurer to be allowed credit for sums paid in pursuance of warrant. 3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Short title.

4. This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act of 1913-1914, No. 3."
