An Act to Apply Certain Sums of Money out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Years ending on the last days of June, 1919 and 1920, and certain further Sums to the Service of the Year ended on the last day of June, 1918, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in the last and present Sessions of Parliament.

[ASSENTED TO 23RD OCTOBER, 1918.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—

Preamble.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to your Majesty in the last and present Sessions of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Appropriation.
[Schedule,
Parts A, B, C,
and D.]

1. In addition to the several sums specified in the Parts marked respectively A, B, C, and D of the Schedule to this Act, and which sums are payable under the authority of the several Acts in those Parts respectively mentioned, there shall and may be issued and applied, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the sums following, inclusive of the three several sums of Four hundred and fifty thousand pounds, One million six hundred and fifty thousand pounds, and One million six hundred and fifty thousand pounds already authorised to be applied towards the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, by **"The Appropriation Act of 1917-1918, No. 4,"* †*"The Appropriation Act of 1918-1919, No. 1,"* and *"The Appropriation Act of 1918-1919, No. 2,"* that is to say,—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the

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credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Six million four hundred and sixty-four thousand nine hundred and ninety-four pounds;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of Two million six hundred and eighty-six thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine pounds six shillings and four pence;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of Two million one hundred and twenty-one thousand one hundred and fifty-one pounds.

2. There shall and may be issued and applied, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, the sums following, that is to say:—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Five hundred thousand pounds;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of One hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

3. The sums granted by the first section of this Act and by **"The Appropriation Act of 1917-1918, No. 4,"* †*"The Appropriation Act of 1918-1919, No. 1,"* and *"The Appropriation Act of 1918-1919, No. 2,"* and which are set forth in the Parts marked respectively F, G, and H of the Schedule to this Act, amounting, as appears by the said Parts, in all to the sum of Eleven million two hundred and seventy-two thousand nine hundred and seventy-four pounds six shillings and four pence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, for the purposes and services expressed in the said Parts F, G, and H, respectively.

4. In addition to the sum specified in the Part marked E of the Schedule to this Act, and which sum was lawfully paid for the service of the year ended on the

last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, under the authority of the Acts in that Part mentioned, there shall and may also be issued and applied the further sums following, that is to say,—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, a further sum of Three hundred and sixty-five thousand six hundred and sixty-five pounds eleven shillings and three pence ;

From the Trust and Special Funds a further sum of One hundred and eighty-four thousand eight hundred and fifty-one pounds twelve shillings and two pence ;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account a further sum of Forty-three thousand nine hundred and fifteen pounds seven shillings and four pence ;

to defray Supplementary Charges for the service of the said year ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and such sums shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, for the purposes and services expressed in the Parts marked I, K, and L of the Schedule to this Act.

Treasurer to pay moneys as directed by warrant.

5. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several sums, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order under his hand and directed to the Treasurer, from time to time orders and directs, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland.

Treasurer to be allowed credit for sums paid in pursuance of warrant.

6. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrants or orders, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the moneys are paid shall be a valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for any sum therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity. [Schedule, Parts I, K, and L.]

7. The issue or application of any part or parts of the said sums of Three hundred and sixty-five thousand six hundred and sixty-five pounds eleven shillings and

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three pence, One hundred and eighty-four thousand eight hundred and fifty-one pounds twelve shillings and two pence, and Forty-three thousand nine hundred and fifteen pounds seven shillings and four pence, which has been made before the passing of this Act for the purposes expressed in the Parts marked I, K, and L of the Schedule to this Act, is hereby authorised and sanctioned, and the Treasurer is hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of any such issue or application.

8. This Act may be cited as "*The Appropriation Act* Short title. of 1918-1919, No. 3."

[ASSENTED TO 14TH NOVEMBER, 1918.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Dingo and Marsupial Destruction Act of 1918*," and shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen. Short title and commencement of Act.
