MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—

WE, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in the last and present Sessions of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Preamble.

1. In addition to the several sums specified in the Parts marked respectively A, B, C, D, and E of the Schedule to this Act, and which sums are payable under the authority of the several Acts in those Parts respectively mentioned, there shall and may be issued and applied, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the sums following, inclusive of the three several sums of One million four hundred and

fifty thousand pounds, Three million three hundred thousand pounds, and Two million six hundred and fifty thousand pounds already authorised to be applied towards the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, by **"The Appropriation Act of 1919-1920, No. 5,"* †*"The Appropriation Act of 1920-1921, No. 1,"* and *"The Appropriation Act of 1920-1921, No. 2,"* that is to say:—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Nine million and sixty thousand four hundred and ninety-seven pounds;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of Three million four hundred and forty-one thousand seven hundred and seventy-eight pounds two shillings and six pence;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of Four million and three thousand four hundred and eighty-four pounds.

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2. There shall and may be issued and applied, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, the sums following, that is to say:—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Six hundred thousand pounds;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of Three hundred thousand pounds;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

Appropriation of sums voted for Supply services.

3. The sums granted by the first section of this Act and by **"The Appropriation Act of 1919-1920, No. 5,"* †*"The Appropriation Act of 1920-1921, No. 1,"* and *"The Appropriation Act of 1920-1921, No. 2,"* and which are set forth in the Parts marked respectively G, H, and I of the Schedule to this Act, amounting, as appears by the said Parts, in all to the sum of Sixteen million five hundred

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and five thousand seven hundred and fifty-nine pounds two shillings and six pence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, for the purposes and services expressed in the said Parts G, H, and I respectively.

4. In addition to the sum specified in the Part marked F of the Schedule to this Act, and which sum was lawfully paid for the service of the year ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, under the authority of the Acts in that Part mentioned, there shall and may also be issued and applied the further sums following, that is to say,—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland, exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, a further sum of One million and forty thousand five hundred and thirty pounds eight shillings and eleven pence ;

From the Trust and Special Funds a further sum of One hundred and seventeen thousand two hundred and eighty-seven pounds five shillings and nine pence ;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account a further sum of Six hundred and forty-four thousand and eighty-nine pounds ten shillings and eleven pence ;

to defray Supplementary Charges for the service of the said year ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and such sums shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, for the purposes and services expressed in the Parts marked K, L, and M of the Schedule to this Act.

5. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several sums, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order under his hand and directed to the Treasurer, from time to time orders and directs, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland.

6. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrants or orders, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom

the moneys are paid shall be a valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for any sum therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

7. The issue or application of any part or parts of the said sums of One million and forty thousand five hundred and thirty pounds eight shillings and eleven pence, One hundred and seventeen thousand two hundred and eighty-seven pounds five shillings and nine pence, and Six hundred and forty-four thousand and eighty-nine pounds ten shillings and eleven pence, which has been made before the passing of this Act for the purposes expressed in the Parts marked K, L, and M of the Schedule to this Act, is hereby authorised and sanctioned, and the Treasurer is hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of any such issue or application.

Short title.

8. This Act may be cited as "*The Appropriation Act of 1920-1921, No. 3.*"

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title
and

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Income Tax Act Amendment Act of 1920, No. 2,*" and shall be read as one with *"*The Income Tax Act of 1902*" and its several amendments (herein collectively referred to as the Principal Act).

Amendment

2. In subsection twelve of section seven of the Principal Act the words "under paragraphs (vii.) and (viii.) of section twelve of this Act" are repealed, and the words "under paragraph (vii.) of section twelve of this Act" are inserted in lieu thereof.
