E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, D by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as "The Hawkers Acts Amendment Act of 1905."

Applications for licenses to be referred to Home Secretary.

2. After the passing of this Act, no application made by any person to a police magistrate or any two justices of the peace sitting in court of petty sessions for a license under the provisions of "The Hawkers and Pedlers Act of 1849," as amended by "The Hawkers Licenses Amendment Act of 1869,"* shall be granted until the matter of such application has been referred by the court to the Home Secretary with such report and recommendation thereon as the court thinks proper to make; and the Home Secretary may in his discretion grant or refuse such application.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent the Court from refusing any such application in the first

instance without such reference as aforesaid.
