2. (1.) Section six of the Principal Act is hereby repealed. Repeal of s. 6.

(2.) Clause four of the Form of Declaration set out in the Schedule to the Principal Act is hereby repealed. Amendment of Schedule.

3. From and after the passing of this Act any child (and whether born before, on, or after the passing of this Act), may be legitimated under and pursuant to \**"The Legitimation Acts, 1899 to 1938,"* notwithstanding that at the date of the birth of such child there existed a legal impediment to the intermarriage of the parents of such child. Effect of repeal of s. 6.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Nurses and Masseurs Registration Acts Amendment Act of 1938,*" and shall be read as one with † "*The Nurses and Masseurs Registration Acts, 1928 to 1933,*" hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act. Short title and construction.

The Principal Act and this Act may be collectively cited as "*The Nurses and Masseurs Registration Acts, 1928 to 1938.*" Collective title.

*Amendment of the Principal Act.*

New s. 8A.

2. The Principal Act is hereby amended by the insertion therein after section eight of the following new section numbered 8A, namely :—

Unregistered  
person not  
to wear  
nurse's cap.

“ [8A.] (1.) No person shall wear a nurse's cap unless such person is registered under this Act as a nurse :

Provided that nothing in this section shall apply to a member of a religious order who wears a habit to conform to the requirements or custom of such order, nor to any person who, when taking part in a religious rite, wears any raiment customary or necessary therefor.

(2.) For the purposes of this section the term “ nurse's cap ” means the cap commonly worn by trained nurses consisting of a piece of white material so folded that when worn portion thereof hangs to or below the shoulder.”
