THE NURSES AND MASSEURS REGISTRATION ACTS AMENDMENT ACT OF 1938.

[ASSENTED TO 24TH NOVEMBER, 1938.]

B E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled. and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as "The Nurses and Short title Masseurs Registration Acts Amendment Act of 1938," and construction construction. and shall be read as one with †" The Nurses and Masseurs Registration Acts, 1928 to 1933," hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act.

The Principal Act and this Act may be collectively Collective cited as "The Nurses and Masseurs Registration Acts, title. 1928 to 1938."

Amendment of the Principal Act.

New s. 8A.

2. The Principal Act is hereby amended by the insertion therein after section eight of the following new section numbered 8A, namely:—

Unregistered person not to wear nurse's cap.

"[8A.] (1.) No person shall wear a nurse's cap unless such person is registered under this Act as a nurse:

Provided that nothing in this section shall apply to a member of a religious order who wears a habit to conform to the requirements or custom of such order, nor to any person who, when taking part in a religious rite, wears any raiment customary or necessary therefor.

(2.) For the purposes of this section the term "nurse's cap" means the cap commonly worn by trained nurses consisting of a piece of white material so folded that when worn portion thereof hangs to or below the shoulder."
