An Act for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year ending June Thirtieth, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

[Assented to, December 14th, 1912.]

THEREAS, by various Acts and Ordinances of the State of Preamble. South Australia, certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty, His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 & 64 Vict., ch. 12—

Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows:

1. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Aus-Further issue. tralia, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued the sum of One Million Nine Hundred and Forty-two Thousand Six Hundred and Eight Pounds.

2. Out of the sum of Six Hundred Thousand Pounds issued Appropriation of under the authority of the Act No. 1074 of 1912, the sum of Six General Revenue. Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 1077 of 1912, and the said sum of One Million Nine Hundred and Forty-two Thousand Six Hundred and Eight Pounds by
