An Act for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year ending June Thirtieth, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighteen.

[Assented to, November 8th, 1917.]

WHEREAS, by various Acts and Ordinances of the State of Preamble.
South Australia, certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty, His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 & 64 Vict., ch. 12:

Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows:

1. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued the sum of Two Million One Hundred and Twenty-one Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two Pounds. Further issue.

2. Out of the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 1270 of 1917, the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 1271 of 1917, and the said sum of Two Million One Hundred and Twenty-one Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two Pounds Appropriation of General Revenue.

Appropriation Act.—1917.

Pounds by this Act authorised to be issued, there shall or may be applied in the manner hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say—

For defraying the charge of the State Government for the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, there shall be paid the sum of Three Million Seven Hundred and Twenty-one Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two Pounds, the said amount being appropriated as follows, viz.:—

3. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, of any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor has heretofore directed by any order or orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, or may hereafter direct by any order or orders so signed and countersigned, is hereby authorised; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums have been or are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall be or are respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

Treasurer to pay the orders of Governor, and discharge by receipt of party.
