

ORDINANCE enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

For the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-seven.

[2nd September, 1846.]

WHEREAS by the Acts or Ordinances of this Province, relative Preamble. to the Customs and Trade, and other Acts or Ordinances of this Province, certain duties, fines, and other moneys are or may be imposed, levied, and collected, to be paid to the Colonial Treasurer, on behalf of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, for the public uses of the Province, and support of the Government thereof:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of South Australia, Appropriation of gewith the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof: neml Revenue for That out of the said duties, and the produce of all or any other the public revenue of the Province, not otherwise by law specially provided for, which shall from time to time accrue or become payable '

payable during the year one thousand eight hundred and forty. seven, or which shall be otherwise unappropriated or unprovided for by law at the commencement of that year, there shall or may he issued and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified; that is to say-First-For the payment of the Salary of His Honor the Judge of the said Province, for the said year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the sum of eight hundred pounds. Secondly-For the delraying the charge of the Civil Establishment of the Province for the said year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, as hereinafter specified, the sum of twenty-seven thousand and eleven pounds thirteen shillings and eleven For Salaries of Officers, and contingent expenses in the establishment of the Governor ..... Grant in aid Christian Religion and Education.

II. And with respect to the sum of Two thousand two hundred and twenty-one pounds to be applied in aid of the purposes of the Christian Religion and Education: BE IT ENACTED, that the same shall be divided amongst the different denominations of professing Christians in proportion to the respective numbers of their population according to the census returns; and shall be paid in proportionate sums to the office-bearers of every such denomination having charge of funds, or other similar matters of a secular nature, according to the constitution and usages of such denomination; or if there shall be no such office-bearers known or applicable to the case, then to such trustees as shall be appointed by or on behalf of any such denomination, in manner to be directed by the Governor. by proclamation published in the South Australian Government Gazette: Upon trust, that the said trustees shall duly apply the moneys so paid, in promoting Religion or Education, as they mar deem most just and beneficial, having regard to the wants of particular localities; and on condition that the said trustees shall. on or before the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, report to the Governor full and true statements and accounts of the due outlay of the moneys; such statements and accounts to be by the Governor laid before the Legislative Council, as soon as may be after the then next assembling thereof.

Jewish Persussion.

III. And with respect to the sum of five pounds and sixteen shillings to be applied for the use of the Jewish persuasion: BE IT ENACTED, that the same shall be paid to such Trustces as may be appointed by or on behalf of the said persuasion, in such manner as may be directed by the Governor, by Proclamation published as aforesaid: Upon trust, that the said trustees shall duly apply the moneys so paid, in promoting Religion or Education, as they may deem most just and beneficial, having regard to the wants of particular localities; and on condition, that the said trustees shall, on or before the thirty-first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, report to the Governor full and true statements and accounts of the due outlay of the moneys: such statements and accounts to be by the Governor laid before the Legislative Council as soonas may be after the then next assembling thereof.

Colonial Treasurer of party.

IV. And BE IT ENACTED, that the Colonial Treasurer shall to pay on the orders issue and pay from time to time, any sum or sums of money discharged by receipt for the purposes hereinhefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor for the time being shall, by any order or orders in writing, signed by him, from time to time direct; and the said Treasurer shall.

his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid, shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
