An Act for the general appropriation of the revenue of the State for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 27th October, 1937.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by certain Acts of the State of South Australia, certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty, His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 & 64 Vict. ch. 12—

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act, 1937".

Further issue.

2. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia, and the produce of all or any other General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued the sum of six million and fifty thousand six hundred and ninety-eight pounds.

Appropriation of General Revenue.

3. Out of the sum of eight hundred thousand pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 2338 of 1937, the sum of one million two hundred thousand pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 2339 of 1937, and the said sum of six million and fifty thousand six hundred and ninety-eight pounds by this Act authorised to be issued, there shall or may be applied in the manner hereinafter mentioned, any sums of

money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say-

For defraying the charges of the State Government for the Estimates. year ending the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, there shall be paid the sum of eight million and fifty thousand six hundred and ninety-eight pounds, the said amount being appropriated as follows, viz.:-

Treasurer to pay the orders of Governor, and discharge by receipt of party. 4. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, of any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor has heretofore directed by any order or orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, or may hereafter direct by any order or orders so signed and countersigned, is hereby authorised; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums have been or are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts

shall be or are respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

5. If the moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia and the produce of the General Public Revenues of the State are insufficient to make the payments authorised by section from the Common. 2 of this Act, moneys may be issued to make good the deficiency wealth. 2 of this Act, moneys may be issued to make good the deficiency out of loan funds or other public funds or out of moneys raised by way of bank overdraft.

6. The Treasurer may, out of the money appropriated by Power to make this Act, make any payment for which money has been included payments. in the estimates of expenditure of the Government of South Australia passed by the House of Assembly for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, notwithstanding that the payment is—

- (a) in respect of a period prior to the first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven; or
- (b) at a rate in excess of the rate which, during the period in respect of which the payment is made, was in force under any return made by the Classification and Efficiency Board pursuant to the Public Service Act, 1936, or any Act repealed by that Act, or under any regulation of the South Australian Railways Commissioner.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
