An Act for the further Appropriation of the Revenue for the Years one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

[Assented to, 27th January, 1858.]

WHEREAS by the Laws relating to the Customs and Trade, and other Acts and Ordinances of the Province of South Australia, certain duties, fines, and other moneys are or may be imposed, levied, and collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors, for the public uses of the said Province and support of the Government thereof—Be it therefore Enacted, by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. Out of the said duties, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the said Province, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued and applied, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say—

FIRSTLY—For defraying the excess of expenditure for the Government Establishments and Miscellaneous Services beyond the Grants for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand

The Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons, and in such portions, as the Governor for the time being shall, by any order or orders, in writing signed by him, and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, from time to time
direct

Treasurer to pay to the orders of Governor, and discharged by receipt of party.

direct, and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly, and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
