An Act to amend the "Bank Holidays Act, 1873," and the "Civil Service Act, 1874."

[Assented to, November 17th, 1882.]

E it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, Preamble. with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1. After this Act shall come into operation, the "Bank Holidays Alteration of public Act, 1873," and the "Civil Service Act, 1874," shall be read and construed as if the first day of September in every year had been declared a bank holiday and a holiday in the Civil Service, in celebration of the birthday, or the anniversary of the birthday, of His Royal Highness the present Duke of Edinburgh, in lieu of the sixth day of August.
- 2. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, Commencement of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
