An Act relating to Chiropractors.

[Assented to 10th November, 1949.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the " Chiropractic Act, 1949 ".

Interpretation.

2. In this Act, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

" chiropractic " means the system of palpating and adjusting the articulations of the human spinal column by hand only for the relief of nerve pressure :

" chiropractor " means any person whose method of attention to the human body is confined solely to chiropractic.

Practise of chiropractic.

3. Notwithstanding any provisions of the Physiotherapists Act, 1945-1948, or the Medical Practitioners Act, 1919-1946, a chiropractor may practise chiropractic without being registered under either of those Acts.

Treatment at clinics and hospitals.

4. A person practising as a chiropractor under this Act may in connection with his practice use X-rays for the purpose only of producing shadow-photographs of the human spinal column.
