An Act to provide for the allowance of Drawback on Broken Packages exported to New Caledonia and certain other places.

[Assented to, 22nd September, 1875.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the laws relating to the Customs in the Province of South Australia, by making provision for allowing drawback on broken packages of goods exported to the Island of New Caledonia and elsewhere—Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble

1. From and after the day hereinafter appointed for the coming into operation of this Act, Act No. 12 of 1872, intituled "An Act to amend the Customs Act, 1864," shall be read and construed as though the words "and also to all ports in the Islands of New Caledonia, and New Guinea, and the Fiji Islands," had been inserted in the second section of the said Act, immediately after the words "in the said Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria." Drawback allowed on broken packages exported to New Caledonia.

2. This Act shall take effect from the first day of October, 1874, and shall be construed as one Act, with the said Act No. 12 of 1872. Commencement of Act.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
