An Act to amend the Children's Protection and Young Offenders Act, 1979.

[Assented to 24 May 1984]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Children's Protection and Young Short title. Offenders Act Amendment Act, 1984".
- (2) The Children's Protection and Young Offenders Act, 1979, is in this Act referred to as "the principal Act".
- 2. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by procla- Commencement. mation.
- 3. Section 31 of the principal Act is amended by inserting in subsection Amendment of s. 31— (2) after paragraph (c) the following paragraph:

Children's aid panel list.

- (d) persons approved by the Minister of Health.
- 4. Section 32 of the principal Act is amended—

Amendment of

- (a) by inserting in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) after the passage Constitution of children's aid "(other than" the passage "a drug offence or";
- (b) by inserting after paragraph (a) of subsection (1) the following paragraph:
  - (ab) where a drug offence is alleged, a member of the police force, an officer of the Department and a person approved by the Minister of Health;;
- (c) by striking out the word "and" after paragraph (b) of subsection (1);
- (d) by striking out from paragraph (c) of subsection (1) the passage "other offence is" and substituting the passage "offence other than a drug offence are";
- (e) by inserting after paragraph (c) of subsection (1) the following word and paragraph:

- (d) where truancy and a drug offence are alleged, a member of the police force, an officer of the Department, an officer of the Education Department and a person approved by the Minister of Health,;
- (f) by inserting in subsection (1) after the word "chosen" the passage "by the Director-General";

# and

- (g) by inserting after subsection (2) the following subsection:
  - (3) In this section—

"drug offence" means an offence against the Narcotic and Psychotropic Drugs Act, 1934.
