An Act to settle the Boundaries of Sections in a portion of the Hundreds of Encounter Bay, Goolwa, and Waitpinga.

[Assented to, September 10th, 1884.]

HEREAS the original survey of certain sections in the hun- Preamble. dreds of Encounter Bay, Goolwa, and Waitpinga, made in the year 1839, was erroneous as regards those sections, and by reason of the errors contained in such survey some proprietors have, since the making thereof, enjoyed more and others less land than they were respectively entitled to, and the true boundaries of several sections of land have become doubtful: And whereas, owing to lapse of time, it is desirable for the quieting of doubts to confirm the title of each proprietor to the land which he has actually enjoyed, and to make compensation for deficiency of acreage in certain cases—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Encounter Bay, Goolwa, and Short title. Waitpinga Boundaries Act."
- 2. Notwithstanding the claim of any proprietor of land within Boundaries of sections those portions of the hundreds of Encounter Bay, Goolwa, and to be taken to be as in Waitpinga, numbered and delineated in the map hereinafter referred to, and called "The Boundaries Map," to have more or other land than he has actually enjoyed, the boundaries of the several sections of land numbered and delineated in the said map shall henceforth

be taken to be accurately delineated in the said map, and, as so delineated, shall be henceforth accepted by all Courts and persons as the lawful boundaries of such sections.

Roads colored red in map to be henceforth public roads. 3. The roads colored red in the said Boundaries map, and marked by shaded vertical lines in the copy thereof hereto annexed and marked the Second Schedule to this Act are hereby declared, and shall continue to be public roads, freed from the claims of all proprietors through or over whose land they or any of them run, and shall be accepted as such public roads by all Courts and persons.

All other roads to cease to be public roads, and the land over which they go to be free of the public easement, except roads dedicated on sale of allotments.

- 4. The land subject to or occupied by any other roads or ways, (whether the same be apparent or actual roads or ways, or only marked as such upon the Government surveys of eighteen hundred and thirty-nine or eighteen hundred and forty-one, or upon the selling plans, or upon the plans in the land office or the office of the district council of the district, or upon any public maps or plans, or upon any instruments or certificates of title), shall be for ever discharged from any public right of user for roads or ways, and shall form part of the several sections of land through which such roads or ways are respectively shown as passing in the said map, namely:
  - Roads which are shown on the diagrams on land grants, or on the selling plans, and not in the maps kept in the land office or in the office of the district council, but have not been in public use and are not required, and which are colored green in the said Boundaries map, and marked by shaded diagonal lines in the copy thereof hereto annexed:
  - Roads which are shown on public maps and not on the diagrams on land grants or selling plans, but have not been in public use and are not required, and which are colored purple in the said Boundaries map and marked by zigzag lines in the copy thereof hereto annexed:
  - And all other roads not colored in the said Boundaries map and marked in the copy thereof hereto annexed as being existing and necessary roads, except roads or streets dedicated to the public use by the owners of land subdividing the same, and selling portions in allotments.

Proprietors who have less land than they are entitled to may select the deficiency elsewhere. 5. The persons who, at the passing of this Act, shall be or shall thereafter first become entitled to the first estate of freehold in the sections or other tenements, parts of sections in the first column of the Schedule hereto set forth, shall be entitled, at any time within five years from the passing of this Act, or from their becoming so entitled, by themselves or their respective agents, to select from any Crown lands in the province of South Australia, not being town, suburban, or mineral lands, or lands specially reserved and set apart for Government purposes, the acreage of land set against such sections or tenements respectively under the head of deficiency; and the Governor may make grants of the land so chosen accordingly, and such grants shall enure for the benefit of

the several persons entitled to the premises for deficiency of which the grants shall be made, and for the estates and interests to which such persons shall respectively be entitled.

6. So far as regards all estates and interests, whether in possession Land as marked in or not and whether vested or contingent, which at the passing of the map, together with land selected for Act are created in the sections of land on the said Boundaries map deficiency, to be held numbered or delineated, and any part thereof, and any mortgages, charges, liens, and incumbrances thereon, the premises which shall created. be subject to such estates, interests, mortgages, charges, liens, or incumbrances, and to which the same shall attach, shall for all purposes be taken to be the said sections of land, or parts thereof, as so numbered and delineated, and of the boundaries and area as set forth in the said map, together with such other land, if any, as may be granted by the Governor in respect of deficiency as hereinbefore provided.

7. As soon as practicable after the passing of this Act the Registrar to register trar-General shall, without fee, register such land grants as may be granted for granted by the Governor in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore deficiency. contained.

grants granted for

8. In respect of such portions of the land comprised in the Registrar to issue new said map as have at the passing of this Act been brought under the Real Property Acts, or may hereafter be brought under the said Acts, it shall be the duty of the Registrar, upon request and without fee, to issue to the parties having estates or interests in the said lands new certificates of title thereto expressed to be granted in pursuance of this Act, and containing a diagram setting out the numbers, boundaries, and area of the premises as set out and delineated on the said map.

certificates of title gratuitously.

9. The map hereinbefore referred to as "The Boundaries Map," Map to be conclusive shall be kept in the office of the Surveyor-General, and shall be marked "The Encounter Bay, Goolwa, and Waitpinga Boundaries Map," and shall be signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and the Surveyor-General, and this Act shall be referred to by title and number thereon, and the same shall be conclusive on all Courts and persons as to the boundaries and area of the several sections of land numbered and contained therein, and of all existing and continuing public roads, as confirmed or created by this Act, and of the land being freed and discharged from all other roads or intended roads, as hereinbefore provided, and the reduced copy of the said map annexed to this Act shall in like manner be conclusive on all Courts and persons, save so far as it may be shown to differ from the original.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
