An Act to amend the Fauna and Flora Reserve Act,
1919-1935.

[Assented to 7th November, 1940.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South
Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament
thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Fauna and Flora Reserve Act Amendment Act, 1940". Short titles.

(2) The Fauna and Flora Reserve Act, 1919-1935, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Fauna and Flora Reserve Act, 1919-1940".

(3) The Fauna and Flora Reserve Act, 1935, is hereinafter called "the principal Act".

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation.

3. The following section is hereby enacted and inserted in the principal Act after section 16 thereof :— Enactment of s. 16a of principal Act—

16a. (1) As from the passing of the Fauna and Flora Reserve Act Amendment Act, 1940— Alteration of area of Flinders Chase.

(a) there shall be added to Flinders Chase the land indicated by yellow colouring on the plan signed "A. D. Smith, Deputy Surveyor-General" and deposited in the Land Office on the thirty-first day of July nineteen hundred and forty and numbered 327 ;

(b) there shall be excluded from Flinders Chase the land indicated by pink colouring on the said plan.

(2) The land excluded from Flinders Chase by this section shall revert to the Crown and may be dealt with as Crown lands.

(3) The Governor may issue to the board a grant of the land added to Flinders Chase by this section.

(4) Upon the application of the board the Registrar-General shall make in the register book and on any duplicate land grant relating to the land excluded from Flinders Chase by this section an indorsement stating that that land has been excluded from Flinders Chase and has reverted to the Crown.
