ORDINANCE enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

To regulate Fees on Instruments passing under the Public Seal of the Province, and certain other Instruments.

[8th July, 1846.]

BE IT ENACTED, by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, That from and after the passing hereof, it shall be lawful for the Colonial Treasurer to take and receive for and in respect of every Deed of Grant, Warrant, and other Instrument which shall be passed under the Public Seal of the Province, or under the Governor's Seal respectively, the several fees specified and contained in the Schedule hereto annexed, in lieu of all other fees on such instruments except such fees as are specially excepted in the said Schedule; which respective fees shall be appropriated to Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, for the public uses of the Province and support of the Government thereof.

Fees may be taken on Public Instruments.

II. GOVERNOR'S SEAL.

For every warrant of appointment to office until Her Majesty's pleasure be known, and every provisional appointment not required to be passed under the Public Seal	0 10 6
For every warrant of appointment required by law, to be under the Governor's Hand and Seal	0 10 6
For every certificate of any notarial attestation, or authenticating any document which is to operate out of the Province	0 10 6
For every other instrument under the Governor's Hand and Seal, except all warrants and orders for payment of public moneys	0 10 6
