An Act to amend the "Game Act, 1874."

[Assented to, September 30th, 1885.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the "Game Act, 1874"— Preamble.
Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. No person shall at any time kill, or attempt to kill or destroy, any game, native game, or special game with any device or instrument known as a swivel or punt gun, or other fixed gun, rifle, or firearm, or with any gun or rifle other than such guns and rifles as are habitually raised at arm's length and fired from the shoulder; and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty Pounds for the first offence; for the second offence shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Fifty Pounds; and for a third or subsequent offence, in addition to the last-mentioned fine, may be imprisoned with hard labor for not exceeding six months. This section shall also apply to the aborigines. Certain weapons prohibited.

2. This Act and the "Game Act, 1874," shall be incorporated, and read and construed together as one Act. To be read with Game Act, 1874.
