ORDINANCE enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

To Repeal the Ordinance No. 3 of 1845, and to provide for the payment of the Salary of the Governor of South Australia out of the General Revenues of the Province.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the salary of the Governor Preamble.
should be chargeable on the general Revenues of the Province—

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED, by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that from and after the passing hereof, an Ordinance passed Repeal of Ordinance 1845, No. 3.
on the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the payment of the Salary of the Governor of South Australia out of the Revenues of the Customs of the said Province," shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, that the Colonial Treasurer shall and may henceforth issue and pay to the Governor the sum of one thousand five hundred pounds sterling, upon such days, times, and periods in each and every year, as the Governor shall, by any orders in writing signed by him, from time to time direct; and that the Yearly salary of £1500 to be paid out of the general Revenues, on the order of the Governor.

payments so to be made, shall be charged upon, and shall be payable out of, the general public Revenues of the Province ; and the said Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for any sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly, not exceeding for any one year the sum hereinbefore mentioned ; and the receipts of the Governor shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer, for the sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
