time being shall, by any orders in writing signed by him, from time to time direct, and that the payments so to be made shall be charged upon, and shall be payable out of, the Revenues received from the Customs payable in this Province, and the said Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for any sum or sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly, not exceeding for any one year the sum hereinbefore mentioned, and the receipts of such Governor shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer for the sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
