An Act to further amend the Health Act, 1898.

[Assented to, November 27th, 1918.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as the "Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1918."

(2) The Health Acts, 1898 to 1916, and this Act may be cited together as the "Health Acts, 1898 to 1918." Short titles.

(3) In this Act the Health Act, 1898, is referred to as "the principal Act."

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. No 711 of 1898.

3. Upon the receipt of a certificate in writing from the Central Board of Health that any infectious disease exists within the State and that isolation is necessary to prevent the spreading thereof, or that there is danger of an outbreak of infectious disease occurring in the State and that isolation is necessary to prevent such outbreak, the Governor may authorise the Central Board of Health to stop all or any traffic and to limit and prevent the ingress, egress and regress of any persons to or from any house or premises, or to limit and prevent the carriage of any persons in any vehicle for such time and in such manner as the Governor may think necessary. Incorporation with other Acts.
Power to prevent spread of disease by isolation.
