An Act to amend "The Insolvent Act Further Amendment Act, 1914."

[Assented to, October 1st, 1915.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as the "Insolvent Act Further Amendment Act, 1915." Short titles.

(2) "The Insolvent Acts, 1886 to 1914," and this Act may be cited together as "The Insolvent Acts, 1886 to 1915." No. 385 of 1886.
No. 404 of 1887.
No. 655 of 1896.
No. 1162 of 1914.

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation with other Acts.

3. The repeal by "The Insolvent Act Further Amendment Act, 1914," of the provisions therein mentioned of section 175 of "The Insolvent Act, 1886," shall not— Repeal of certain provisions by Act No. 1162 of 1914, not to affect offences and things theretofore committed or done.

I. affect the operation of such provisions, or alter the effect of the commission of any offence or of the doing or omission of anything, prior to such repeal; or

II. affect any liability, or any punishment, incurred or imposed, or liable to be incurred or imposed, prior to such repeal; or

III. affect any investigation or legal proceeding in respect of any such offence, thing, or liability.

Insolvent Act Further Amendment Act.—1915.

Any such investigation or legal proceeding may be instituted or continued, and any such punishment may be imposed and enforced, as if the provisions so repealed were still in force.

Application of this Act.

4. This Act shall not affect any judgment or order of any Court given or made before the passing of this Act, and shall not apply to any proceedings arising under or consequent on any adjudication of insolvency made between the passing of the Insolvent Act Further Amendment Act, 1914, and the passing of this Act; but otherwise this Act shall have the same effect as if section 3 hereof had been enacted in the Insolvent Act Further Amendment Act, 1914, when that Act was passed.
