## No. 1574.

An Act to amend the Impounding Act, 1920.

[Assented to, November 28th, 1923.]

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Impounding Act Amendment Act, 1923." Short titles.

(2) The Impounding Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act"), and this Act may be cited together as the "Impounding Acts, 1920 and 1923." No. 1441 of 1920.

2. Section 4 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (1) thereof the following subsection:— Amendment of principal Act, s. 4—

(1A) Any Council may join with any other Council or Councils in the establishment or maintenance of any public pound, notwithstanding that such public pound is not within the District of such first-mentioned Council. Councils may establish joint pounds.

3. Section 46 of the principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted in lieu thereof:— Provision substituted for s. 46 of principal Act—

46. If any cattle are found straying, or at large, or tethered, or depastured, in any street or public place within any town or township, the owner shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two Pounds. Owner of straying cattle liable to penalty.
