An Act to further amend the Impounding Act, 1920.

[Assented to, November 19th, 1925.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Impounding Act Amendment Act, 1925." Short titles.

(2) The Impounding Acts, 1920 and 1923, and this Act may be cited together as the "Impounding Acts, 1920 to 1925."

(3) The Impounding Act, 1920, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act." No. 1441 of 1920.

2. Section 10 of the principal Act is hereby repealed. Repeal of principal Act, s. 10.

3. Subsection (1) of section 26 of the principal Act is amended so as to read as follows:— Amendment of *ibid.*, s. 26—

(1) Every poundkeeper may charge—

(a) the sum of One Shilling for delivery or sending by post the notice of impounding; and

(b) the sum of Three Shillings and Six Pence for publishing the notice of impounding in the *Government Gazette*.

Service and publication of notice.

4. Section 46 of the principal Act (as enacted by section 3 of the Impounding Act Amendment Act, 1923) is amended by adding at the Amendment of *ibid.*, s. 46.

the end thereof the following subsection (the preceding portion of the said section being read as subsection (1) thereof):—

Facilitation of proof.

(2) In any proceedings for an offence against this section, the allegation in the complaint that any street or public place is situated within a town or township shall be deemed proved in the absence of proof to the contrary.

Second Schedule.**

5. The Second Schedule to the principal Act is hereby repealed.
