An Act to amend the Licensing Act, 1967-1972.

*[Assented to 8th November, 1973]*

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

**Short titles.**

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1973".

(2) The Licensing Act, 1967-1972, as amended by this Act may be cited as the "Licensing Act, 1967-1973".

(3) The Licensing Act, 1967-1972, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

2. Section 18 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (2d) the following subsection:—

(2e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, but subject to this section, a licence may be granted in each year by the court to any body or authority administering the Bavarian International Festival authorizing it, subject to such conditions as the court thinks fit and specifies in the licence, to sell or supply liquor of any kind and in any quantities to the public during

the continuance of the Bavarian International Festival at such times over a period not exceeding three days (which may include a Sunday) and at such places, as the court thinks fit and specifies in the licence.

(2f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, but subject to this section, where the court is of the opinion that a festival or proposed festival is of substantial historical, traditional or cultural significance and that there are substantial grounds warranting the grant of a licence under this subsection, the court may grant to the body or authority responsible for the administration of the festival a licence authorizing it, subject to such conditions as the court thinks fit and specifies in the licence, to sell or supply liquor of any kind and in any quantities to the public during the continuance of the festival at such times over such a period not exceeding three days (which may include a Sunday) and at such places as the court thinks fit and specifies in the licence.
