An Act to suspend the operation of certain provisions of the Life Assurance Companies Act, 1936-1941.

[Assented to 21st October, 1943.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short title.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Life Assurance Companies Act (Partial Suspension) Act, 1943".
- Suspension of ss. 45, 46 and 47 of Life Assurance Companies Act.
- 2. (1) Sections 45, 46 and 47 of the Life Assurance Companies Act 1936, shall not apply in relation to any financial year or half-year, the whole or any part of which year or half-year falls within the period of the continuance of the present war.
- (2) In this section "the present war" means the war which commenced on the third day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, and includes any other war in which His Majesty has become or becomes engaged during the continuance of that war; and for purposes of this section the present war shall be deemed to continue until the day on which Australia by reason of a general armistice or other arrangements ceases to be engaged in warlike operations in that war.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
