An Act to provide that a certain casual vacancy in the Legislative Council need not be filled.

Royal Assent Proclaimed 23rd March, 1944.]*

WHEREAS on the fourteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and forty-three a vacancy occurred in the seat of the Honourable Frank Andrew Halleday, one of the members representing the Legislative Council electoral district known as the Southern District: AND WHEREAS by reason of the short period for which the person elected to fill that vacancy would hold office, and the shortage of men and materials due to the war, it is expedient that an election to fill the vacancy should not be held: NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Legislative Council Vacancy Act, 1943". Short title.

2. Notwithstanding any provision of the Constitution Act, 1934-1942, it shall not be necessary to fill the casual vacancy in the Legislative Council caused by the retirement of the Honourable Frank Andrew Halleday on the fourteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and forty-three. Provision for not holding election.

Reserved for the signification of His Majesty the King's pleasure thereon.
