An Act to refer to the Parliament of the Commonwealth certain matters relating to the inspection of meat.

[Assented to 5 March 1987]

The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the “Meat Inspection (Commonwealth Powers) Act, 1987”. Short title.

2. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation. Commencement.

3. In this Act— Interpretation.
 - “abattoir” means a licensed abattoir under the Meat Hygiene Act, 1980;
 - “meat” means any part, or product resulting from the processing of any part, of the body of any animal, intended for human consumption or for use as animal food.

4. The matter of the inspection of meat at abattoirs in the State, to the extent to which it is not otherwise included in the legislative powers of the Parliament of the Commonwealth, is referred to that Parliament for a period— Reference of legislative powers to the Commonwealth.
 - (a) commencing when this Act comes into operation;
 - and
 - (b) ending on the expiry of this Act,

but no longer.

5. If the Governor fixes, by proclamation, a day for the expiry of this Act, it will expire on the day so fixed. Expiry of this Act.
