ORDINANCE enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

To amend an Ordinance, intituled "An Ordinance to define the Qualifications of Medical Practitioners in this Province for certain purposes. [3rd July, 1846.]

THEREAS Members of the Company or Society of Apothe- Preamble. caries of London are not, as such, legally qualified Medical Practitioners:

Be it therefore Enacted, by the Governor of South Australia, with 7 and 8 Vict., No. 17, the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, That from part repealed. and after the passing hereof, so much of an Ordinance passed on the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fortyfour, intituled "An Ordinance to define the Qualifications of Medical Practitioners in this Province for certain purposes," as enacts that any Member of the Company of Apothecaries of London shall, on complying with the provisions of the said Ordinance, be deemed a legally qualified Medical Practitioner for the purposes therein mentioned, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

II. And

Apothecaries having practice-certificates from the Society of London, or who were in practice prior to 1815, deemed legally qualified Medical Practitioners.

II. And be it Enacted, That every person who shall have proved to the satisfaction of the majority of the Members present, not being less than three, of "The South Australian Medical Board," that he has obtained a certificate of qualification to practise as an Apothecary from the Court of Examiners of the Society of Apothecaries of the City of London, or that he was in practice as an Apothecary prior to or on the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, shall be deemed a legally qualified Medical Practitioner within the meaning of the recited Ordinance.
