An Act to amend the "Northern Territory Customs Act, 1882."

[Assented to, September 10th, 1884.]

THEREAS it is desirable to amend the "Northern Territory Preamble. Customs Act, 1882," in manner hereinafter appearing—Be it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1. Sections 4, 5, and 6 of the "Northern Territory Customs Act, Repeal of sections. 1882," providing for the collection of a duty on gold exported from the Northern Territory, are hereby repealed as from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.
- 2. Before any gold shall be shipped, or water-borne to be shipped, Return of gold exfrom any place within the Northen Territory, the exporter or his ported. agent shall deliver to the principal or other proper officer of Customs at such place a written return specifying the quantity of such gold, and shall produce such gold to such officer, at a reasonable time and place, to be fixed by such officer, for the purpose of enabling such officer to examine such gold, and to check the accuracy of such return; and if any exporter or agent shall make any default in complying with the requirements of this section, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Two Pounds or more than Ten Pounds for every such offence.

3. Except so far as inconsistent therewith this Act shall be incorporated and read as one with "The Customs Act, 1864," and the "Northern Territory Customs Act, 1880."
